## VOLUNTEERS NEEDED TO SERVE LUNCH AT MUST IN MARIETTA

Volunteers at MUST serve more than half a million meals annually. The open lunch meal, served in the Loaves and Fishes Kitchen on the Marietta campus, draws the largest crowd of the day.

"During weekdays, that meal is open to anyone in the community who is hungry," said Megan Dorris, director of volunteers for MUST. Meals are served by volunteers and groups from the community.

Serving a lunch of barbeque, baked beans and slaw recently was the law office of Fredrick J. Hanna in Marietta. Hanna, who began volunteering at MUST more than 15 years ago, said he set up the lunch as an outreach program of the Cobb Bar Association several years ago and his office fills the monthly slot twice a year.

"We do it to give back to the community," Hanna said. "When you help by feeding somebody, you get that good feeling. I'm doing this because I want to give them a good meal. It makes you feel humble."

While meal volunteers are scheduled a year in advance, only 80 percent of the dates are filled. "We still need volunteers to serve meals, not just lunch, but breakfast and dinner," Ms. Dorris said. To volunteer call Sherisse Goodman at 770-427-9862 ext. 1112.
